#### Dear Parents/Carers,

#### Staff

# Class Dojo

This year the school will be using the Class Dojo app to communicate with parents with regards to behaviour. By downloading this free app, you will be notified when your child is given house points and it will say what it is for. Parents will be sent an invitation shortly via a letter in your child's bag to

join the class. Please note, teachers **will not** be responding to any messages sent on Class Dojo, so please continue to contact the school office for messages and enquiries.

#### Homework

All children are expected to **read for a minimum of 10 minutes daily**. They have been given a reading record book to record their reads (this can be done by themselves or by an adult). They will receive a Dojo point for being 'Responsible Readers'.

Children will receive a **weekly homework task in their homework books**. This will be set on a Friday, to be handed in on Thursdays. This will be a maths/English or Science based task.

Children are also expected to continue practising their **times tables skills using Times Table Rockstars**. Children should already have their login, but this will also be put in their homework books.

#### <u>PE</u>

PE will be on Thursday with Miss Baker. Children should wear their PE kit into school on that day. PE kit should be a plain white T-shirt and dark (navy/black) bottoms and jumper when needed (not hooded), plus suitable trainers.

#### Science

Whales will be learning all about plants this half term. We'll begin by reading 'The Story of Frog Belly Rat Bone' by Timothy Basil Ering



Children will be identifying parts of flowering plants, setting up an investigation into the effect of fertiliser on plant growth, discovering how water is transported in plants, and finding out about pollination and fertilisation.

<u>Key Vocab</u>: flower, petal, stem, roots, prediction, conclusion, transpiration, pollination, fertilisation.

### Mathematics

We begin the term by revisiting and recapping Place Value and number, embedding our counting skills and partitioning 3 and 4 digit numbers. We will then move on to addition and subtraction later this half term. We will also be doing regular times table practice.

Key Vocab: place value, ones, tens, hundreds, thousands, partition, addition, subtraction, equals.

## Computing.

This term we will be starting by focusing on some online safety to make sure that all of the children are safe when using a computer and the internet both when at home and when at school. We will then be having a go at using Google Sheets to understand how formulae can be used.

*Key Vocab:* formulae, column, row, spreadsheet.

# Religious Education

In Re we will be starting with the theology topic of 'Where do Christian beliefs come from?' This will look at understanding the role of the Bible in Christianity and exploring the teachings of the New Testament and how these link to Christian beliefs.

<u>Key Vocab</u>: authority, new testament, parables, commandments, incarnation, sacrifice.

## History

In History we will be exploring and learning about the history of North Elmham. We have lots of lovely old photographs and maps to look at and to see the visual changes of the area and to explore why these changes may have occurred. In detail we will be looking at the railway, watermill and chapel.

<u>Key Vocab</u>: changes, disused, memorials, census.

## Geography

We will also be focussing on North Elmham in Geography. Looking closely at compass skills, types of maps, map reading and 4 and 6 figure grid references. As well as this, we will be looking at the use of a key within a map and creating sketch maps of North Elmham.

<u>Key Vocab</u>: ordnance survey, grid reference, compass, key, map, atlas.

## PSHE/RSE

This term we will be focussing on feelings and emotions and how to deal with these correctly. We will also be discussing zones of regulations.

# Art and Design This half term, we will be

This half term, we will be exploring typography and drawing maps!

The Book With No Pictures

Children will investigate different typography styles and then create their own. We will then be designing our own maps and illustrating them using our new-found typography skills. Key vocab: lettering, graphics, design, intention, visual impact

# English

Children will be reading 'My
Strong Mind' by Niels van
Hove, and will be writing an
instructional text on how to
deal with challenging
situations in their lives.
'Sentence Stacking' lessons
will help the children
develop their writing skills
before writing their own
instructions.



<u>Key vocab:</u> imperative verbs, adverbs, question, bullet points, alliteration, complex sentence.

We will also be doing daily 'Book Talk' sessions using the Jane Considine Reading Rainbow to improve reading skills. Additionally, we will have daily spelling/phonics and regular handwriting sessions.

## PE

This term we will be focussing on cognitive skills and multi skills. Which will get the children working together and using their hand eye coordination and agility. We will also talk about how being active is part of a healthy lifestyle and ways they could be active at home.

<u>Key vocab:</u> agility, coordination, teamwork.

## French

Bonjour! Salut!
This term we will be focussing on short conversational phrases and how we can use these to create sentences to greet each other and hold basic conversations.

## Music

In Music this term we will looking at the music from the musical Mamma Mia. This will involve learning the structure of songs linked to literacy and the music and styles of the 70s and 80s songs, as well as analysing performances.

VOCAB: Keyboard, electric guitar, bass, drums, improvise, compose, melody, pulse, rhythm,
